Brown was also involved in many community boards and organizations. She served as Board Chair of the Humanitarian Enterprise of Lincoln Parish. Brown also served in several leadership positions with the Lincoln Parish NAACP. She was named president of the Lincoln Parish Retired Educators, a local unit of retired teachers that is associated with LRTA.

Brown graduated from the University of Denver in Colorado with a bachelor's degree. She attended classes at Wayne State University and, ultimately, completed her master's degree at Louisiana Tech University. Brown also completed postgraduate courses at Grambling State University and the University of Louisiana in Lafayette.
