A MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

It is vital to reopen our state and begin economic recovery in controlled phases using data and science to guide and support our efforts. Regardless of what phase our state is in, individuals who are at increased risk for COVID-19 need to continue to stay home. Many of our retirees are considered to be at greater risk for COVID-19. For people who are over 65 and/or have pre-existing health conditions, it is critical that we maintain social distancing (staying six feet away from others), wear masks if in public, wash our hands frequently and stay home until we have medications and a vaccine to protect us. Panic and complacency are the benchmarks of the world's response to infectious diseases. with complacency currently on the rise. As we reopen our state, we must make sure that our complacency with the coronavirus does not create a false sense of security.

LRTA will continue to support our members and maintain our goals and objectives using an abundance of caution without placing our members or staff at risk.

Our staff will continue to work remotely from home with everyone submitting a work plan and weekly report for my review. We also conduct periodic staff meetings through conference calls. Each staff member spends one day a week in the office conducting essential business that cannot be conducted at home. However, visitors are not allowed at the LRTA office at this time.

Membership services continue to be our major priority, and keeping retirees informed is a cornerstone for actively lobbying to protect our retirement benefits.

One way we accomplish these goals is to use technology. We have boosted our online presence by frequently updating our website, producing informational videos, posting on social media, and sending Email blasts. We also continue to publish four newsletters a year with useful articles and resources to educate our membership. We are working with our printer to ensure the safe and timely production of the LRTA newsletter.

I want to thank our membership partners AARP and Association Member Benefits Advisors (AMBA) for their assistance with keeping LRTA connected with our members during the pandemic. AARP provided LRTA with the "We Care" grant opportunity to support virtual engagement with our members. You can read more about the grant on page 8. AMBA stayed connected to the office staff and provided social media tools and resources to continue building LRTA's online presence. Our membership coalition with both of these groups is valuable to both LRTA and the retirement community.

The pandemic presented a special set of obstacles in regard to the 2020 Regular Legislative Session. Due to social distancing, our access to the State Capitol was limited. However, we successfully lobbied through emails, letters, and phone calls. LRTA supported the successful passage of HB 8 by Rep. Ryan Bourriaque. The bill was amended during the legislative process, and LRTA was able to change its position to support the amended bill.

We also successfully opposed the introduction of HB 26, 32, 325 and 680. Thank you for staying connected and supporting our legislative priorities during the 2020 Louisiana Legislative Sessions.

The Fall District Meetings are presently on hold until we have more information on large group meetings. We have provided Districts with a tentative meeting schedule but have asked that they do not book a location that might incur cost until we have more information. LRTA has also canceled the casino resort venue for the 2020 Fall State Meeting. While the LRTA Executive Board will meet in the Fall, the board will meet in a smaller location or remotely. Regardless of whether we meet in person or through video or conference calls, our office will continue to provide the tools and resources to keep you, our members, connected.

As we navigate Fall 2020 and Spring 2021, please be reminded, we will stay connected with you through our website, emails, social media and newsletters. Finally, if you need assistance from our staff please call on us by phone or email, because we are here for you.

Until we meet again, stay home and stay safe!

How the OUTBREAK Impacted the Legislative Session

On March 16, House Speaker Rep. Clay Schexnayder and Senate President Senator Page Cortez announced the adjournment of the Legislature to comply with the public health mandate. Legislators returned May 4 to address essential bills. The shortened Legislative Session certainly impacted the retirement bills filed for 2020. The House and Senate Retirement Committees did meet to hear some bills. Rep. Barry Ivey, the author of several optional hybrid retirement plan bills (House Bills 32, 33 and 34), did not run his hybrid bills due to the shortened legislative session and the amount of letters and emails he received from retirees. Rep. Jerome "Zee" Zeringue authored HB 307, which appropriated over \$36 million to paying off the UAL (or debt). See the outcome of the bills heard below.

House Bill 8 by Rep. Ryan Bourriaque

- Establishes that the current returnto-work law only applies to retirees who have returned to work with an employer covered by TRSL on or before June 30, 2020, and to retirees who retired on or before June 30, 2010 (the original grandfathered group).
- Requires a retiree who returns to work with an employer covered by TRSL on or after July 1, 2020, to choose one of the following two options, depending on whether the retiree is re-employed in a fulltime position:
 - Option 1: Have earnings limited to 25% (per fiscal year) of the retiree's final average compensation (FAC) with a reduction in the benefit if the cap is exceeded, or
 - Option 2: (Only available to retirees re-employed in fulltime positions)
 - Have benefits suspended for the duration of reemployment.
 - Return to active member status in TRSL and accrue a supplemental benefit, which will be calculated with the same formula used to determine the original benefit. If reemployed for at least 36 months, the supplemental benefit will be calculated based on the higher of the retiree's original FAC or the FAC since reemployment. If reemployed less than 36 months, the supplemental benefit will be calculated based on the retiree's original FAC.
 - Allows a retiree returning to work under Option 1 to convert to Option 2 any time prior to or after

reaching the allowable 25% earnings limitation (per fiscal year) of the retiree's FAC.

- Establishes that any retiree, who returns to active service after July 1, 2020, and within 12 months after retirement, shall have his retirement benefits suspended for the duration of such active service or the lapse of 12 months from the effective date of his retirement, whichever occurs first.
- Allows a retiree covered by the current return-to-work law to elect to be covered by the new provisions in House Bill 8.
- Requires that any retiree who returns to active service shall have his benefit suspended if such re-employment is based on a contract or corporate contract.
- Establishes that retirees receiving a TRSL disability retirement cannot return to work under any of the proposed provisions.
- Establishes that employer returnto-work reporting requirements, including penalties for failure to report, will be the same as under current law.

LRTA Supported (with amendments), Sent to Governor

House Bill 10 by Rep. Rick Edmonds

Changes the computation of average compensation for TRSL retirees when such calculation is affected by a gap in service that spans more than 10 years, by eliminating compensation limits for months 1 through 12.

LRTA Neutral, Ďid Not Pass

House Bill 307 by Rep. Jerome Zeringue

Makes supplemental payments toward Unfunded Accrued Liability (UAL) for Fiscal Year 2019-2020 LRTA Supported, Sent to Governor

House Concurrent Resolution 9 by Rep. Mike Johnson

Memorializes congress to review and eliminate the provisions of federal law which reduce Social Security benefits for persons receiving pensions from federal, state, or local governmental retirement systems by supporting S.521 of the 116th Congress, the Social Security Fairness Act.

LRTA Supported, Signed by the Speaker

House Resolution 21 by Rep. Lance Harris

Requests the state retirement systems to provide information to the legislature regarding permanent benefit increases for retirees no later than 12/1/2020.

LRTA Supported, Signed by the Speaker

Senate Concurrent Resolution 34 by Senator Beth Mizell

Memorializes congress to review and eliminate the provisions of federal law which reduce Social Security benefits for persons receiving pensions from federal, state, or local governmental retirement systems by supporting S.521 of the 116th Congress, the Social Security Fairness Act.

LRTA Supported, Signed by the President

Senate Resolution 15 by Senator Ed Price

Requests the state retirement systems to provide information to the legislature regarding permanent benefit increases for retirees no later than 12/1/2020.

The Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana adapts and continues serving membership in the age of COVID-19

Normal flew out the window in mid-March when the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana (TRSL) began to transition its staff to a remote workforce in response to the public health emergency declared by Gov. John Bel Edwards.

In those initial days before the governor's stay-at-home order, many state agencies including TRSL were mapping out plans of how to continue providing critical services to the public while keeping both the public and employees safe.

At TRSL's four-story office building in Baton Rouge, which is shared with the Louisiana State Employees' Retirement System (LASERS), management made the decision to provide member services through safer means of communication, specifically phone and email.

"We've always welcomed members to our office for walk-in retirement counseling and services. No appointments necessary," said TRSL Director Dana Vicknair. "But, we felt that moving to customer service through phone and email was the safest course of action given the circumstances."

TRSL also directed members to use its secure, online Member Access portal where actively working members as well as retirees could view their personal retirement accounts, and even use self-service functions like applying for retirement online or updating federal tax withholding information. Members often get the information they need just by logging on to their Member Access accounts.

The retirement system also used its website and broadcast email system to communicate updates to members about services and other COVID-19 information that impacted members.

Operationally, the retirement system had to outfit the majority of its 153-person staff with secure laptops to work from home. With a membership of more than 199,000 people, TRSL had to make sure normal business functions continued without interruption.

"After the governor's stay-at-home order went into effect on March 22, we received a lot of phone calls from retirees, wondering if they would get their April 1 benefit payments," Vicknair said. "Paying benefits on time is our number one priority, and I had no doubt that our staff would do whatever it took to make that happen. I'm happy to say we got the job done."

TRSL has since made May and June benefit payments to more than 79,000 retirees and beneficiaries without a hitch. And, the dozens of other retirement processes—from new retirement and beneficiary payment setups to disability retirements to service credit purchases—continue to be handled in a timely manner albeit remotely.

"We're tracking just about everything in this strange new world of living and doing business," said TRSL Assistant Director Jeff LaCour. "The number of phone calls peaked to more than 1,800 during the third week of May and we've had more people reach out to us through email during this time. Now, we're excited about tracking our newest member service—teleconference retirement counseling through virtual meeting technology."

TRSL recently began offering teleconference counseling by appointment to members with questions about their retirements. This expansion of the system's member services seemed natural since so many people are using virtual meeting technology to connect with friends, family and others for personal and professional reasons.

As TRSL enters its busy summer season, which typically means an increase of retirement application submissions and member visits to the office, plans are in place to bring more staff back into the office and resume face-to-face member counseling by appointment with appropriate measures in place to keep members and staff safe.

According to Vicknair, even with all the uncertainties created by COVID-19, the staff's commitment to providing quality services to the TRSL membership remains unchanged.

"We recognized that during this pandemic, so many of our members were counting on getting their monthly benefit, or were in the midst of actually retiring, or were in need of some TRSL service upon which their financial livelihood hinged," Vicknair said. "We didn't want to let anyone down, and I'm proud of our staff for getting the work done for our members."

Communicating Through COVID-19

Rodney and I continue to keep in touch through phone calls and emails on a regular basis. We update each other and work together to strategize the next email or Facebook post. We even pieced together a couple of videos for the time being (in fact, there's a picture of us working behind the scenes on the cover of this newsletter). The advancements in technology allow us to continue to update the website and send regular updates to the membership remotely until health restrictions are lifted.

Looking Ahead

Our online tools helped us communicate through a major health crisis. But, we're not putting these tools in the "Break in Case of an Emergency" box. The needs of our membership will continue to evolve, and, fortunately, we will now have the technology to meet their needs. Of course, there's a learning curve for using new forms of technology. I want to thank our members who are following along as we discover new ways to communicate.

We will continue to use these tools to enhance our communication efforts and develop programming to benefit our members. For example, LRTA is currently researching how to conduct webinars with Zoom so we can inform and educate our members remotely. We will still produce videos when we can and as necessary. Make sure to check out the box below with links to our social media and videos.

By no means will the online communication tools diminish the value of traditional communication tools (like the LRTA newsletter). There is a time and place for everything. We are grateful that we have new tools to help us communicate with members and make their retirement years great.
