reductions known as the Government Pension Offset (GPO) and the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP). The reductions affect individuals who work for governmental units that do not participate in Social Security, and reside in communities throughout the United States, not just here in Louisiana. I want to bring all of you up to date on efforts being made by the members of the U.S. Congress on addressing these two provisions. On November 6, 2007, the Senate Committee on Finance held a hearing on S 206, The Social Security Fairness Act of 2007, by Senator Diane Feinstein, D-CA, and others regarding the repeal of GPO and WEP. Dr. Ledet sent a letter to the committee supporting the repeal of the provisions. His letter has been entered into the record of the Senate Finance Committee proceedings.

It is anticipated that the House Ways and Means Committee, Subcommittee on Social Security will hold a similar hearing on HR 82, by Representative Howard Berman, D-CA, and 322 other members of the U.S. House of Representatives. HR *continued on page 6*

Amendments Seek to Reinstate Life Membership, Reduce Associate Membership Dues

At its October meeting, the LRTA Executive Board was presented with two proposals from the LRTA Membership Committee. One proposal was to reinstate Lifetime Membership in LRTA, and the other proposal was to reduce dues for Associate Membership.

After much discussion, the Board agreed to place both proposals on the ballot that LRTA members received with this newsletter. One proposal reinstates LRTA Lifetime Membership with the dues amount equal to twenty times the current annual dues. At this time, annual dues are \$25, so Lifetime Membership dues, if reinstated, would be \$500. The other proposal would reduce Association Membership dues from \$25 to \$10, beginning with the 2008-2009 membership year, which begins on April 1, 2008. Actual changes in wording to the LRTA Constitution and Bylaws are given below.

<u>Underlined items are additions</u> / *(italicized items in parentheses are de-letions)*.

Constitutional Amendments would include:

Article IX: Membership Classifications, Section 4. Lifetime Member: Any person retired from an educational institution in Louisiana (who became) is eligible to become a lifetime member of this corporation (during the period of April 1, 1996 through March 31, 2006) provided that person is (1) a member of the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana or (2) retired from the teaching profession in Louisiana, upon payment of lifetime membership dues.

Bylaws Amendments would include:

Article VII: Fiscal Year and Dues, Section 2. The annual dues for active *(and associate)* member of the Association shall be \$25. Membership dues for local units of retired teachers shall be fixed by each such association.

Section 3. The annual dues for associate members of the Association shall be \$10.00.

Section 4. Dues for a lifetime membership shall be twenty times that of annual membership dues.

82 is also entitled The Social Security Fairness Act of 2007, and contains the same language that would repeal the GPO and WEP, if enacted. I encourage you to write to your members of Congress, and to the members of the subcommittee. Express your concerns and provide examples of how these two Social Security benefit reductions impact your monthly incomes. It is imperative that these members of Congress hear from you.

The members of the Louisiana congressional delegation and their addresses are listed on the LRTA web site at <u>http://www.lrta.net</u> under the link entitled "Social Security Administration Issues." You can also find a sample letter at that location on the web site. In addition, take a minute to copy your letter to all the members of the Subcommittee on Social Security. For the latest information on federal legislation regarding GPO and WEP, including S 206 and HR 82, you can visit <u>http://www.</u> retirementsecurity.org.

If you have specific questions about how the benefit reductions impact you, check with your local Social Security Administration office. We will continue to provide information regarding meetings of the congressional committees dealing with these issues, and will keep you informed of upcoming hearings that may be scheduled.
